





Despite the continuing pandemic, we were fortunate to return National Road Safety Week to its usual time in May. Given that last year's event had been postponed to November 2020, it meant that there would be only six months to deliver a full program of activities! Despite this, our fantastic partners and supporters pulled out all the stops and in that very short six month timeframe, created and implemented a successful Week, all under COVID-19 restrictions. In short, their work and dedication was outstanding.

With this in mind, we remain forever grateful to the Hon Vincent Tarzia MP, South Australian Minister for Police, Emergency Services and Correctional Services and the exceptional team at the South Australian Department for Infrastructure and Transport for hosting and co-ordinating the 2021 Week, creating a highly memorable national launch and rollout of activities across the State, and leading the national planning committee so effectively. I would also especially like to acknowledge the 2021 Road Safety Statement by the Governor-General of Australia, his Excellency General the Honourable David Hurley AC DSC, as well as the steadfast support of both Hon Michael McCormack MP, former Deputy Prime Minister, and Hon Scott Buchholz MP, Commonwealth Assistant Minister for Road Safety and Freight Transport, including their attendance and speeches at the National Launch at the Adelaide Convention Centre.

We can confidently say that the 2021 Week has been our most successful yet, and here are some of our highlights:

- Thousands of Yellow ribbons displayed across Australia - on trees, bikes, cars, buses, vans, emergency service vehicles, offices, depots and community centres.
- More than 45 icons, bridges and buildings lit in yellow including the Sydney Harbour Bridge, Bankwest Stadium, the Adelaide Oval, Melbourne Town Hall, and the Story Bridge in Brisbane. And special mentions to the Big Merino and Big Banana!

- Dedicated TVC with Rove McManus voiceover played on SBS TV and in Federation Square.
- Hundreds of activations by Local Government Associations around the country in shopping centres, at football matches, at local markets and through the streets of local towns.
- 1,630 media articles on TV, radio, print and online reaching a potential audience of 17.4million Australians
- On Twitter alone there was almost 3000 social media posts, or on average 58 mentions a day, from Government, local councils, Police, public transport operators, emergency services, road safety partners, brand ambassadors and supportive individuals about NRSW
- Combined social media channels of Facebook, LinkedIn, Twitter and Instagram reached a potential 20m users.
- Donated advertising space on billboards, electronic signs, RMS signs, radio and websites
- More than 27,000 visitors to the National Road Safety Week website during the week
- More than 10,500 online and written pledges taken to drive so others survive.



Our community should be proud that as a result of their involvement, there was a presence in virtually every community across Australia!

As noted above, an important part of the Week is to encourage our community to take the "Drive So Others Survive!" pledge and over the past few years more than 40,000 Australians have done so. By making this promise they have committed to 'Drive as if their loved ones are on the road ahead'... In other words, to remove all distractions and never use a mobile phone while driving, to not put other people at risk by speeding, driving while tired or under the influence of alcohol/drugs and to actively protect all vulnerable road users, especially those whose job places them in harm's way, by slowing down and giving them the space they need to be safe.

Sadly, despite the incredible efforts of our partners and supporters, our policy makers, police and emergency services and all organisations involved in road safety, fatalities and serious injuries on our nation's roads remain far too high. But we are also proud of the fact that this year's host jurisdiction did not have one fatality on South Australian roads during the Week!

We are grateful that National Road Safety Week now provides an important cross-jurisdictional spotlight on road safety and we acknowledge each of the Commonwealt, State and Territory governments for their support and leadership. We are also grateful that this initiative not just brings to the community's attention the spectre of this avoidable epidemic of fatalities and serious injuries, but moreover, shows that by working together and changing our individual behaviour, we can get everyone home safe to their loved ones ... every day ... without exception.

SARAH's vision is that by increasing the community's commitment to protect every life, there will come a time when there is no longer a need for National Road Safety Week, but in the meantime, we look forward to working with each of you to improve road safety outcomes across our country.




In 2021, traffic to the NRSW website and pledges made to drive so others survive increased by over 200%



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










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Too many lives are lost on our roads and we are all responsible for doing our bit to help make a difference in bringing the toll down.

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I am proud that we have been able to create this week long focus on preventing death and serious injury on our roads and I am honoured that we now have the Commonwealth and every State and Territory supporting us. I am also so grateful for each organisation that supports our campaigns because like us, they recognise that everyone has a right to get home safe to their loved ones, every day, with no exceptions. It is incredible to see such commitment to driving change to make our roads safer.

Yet despite this, National Road Safety Week still fills me with sadness because we created it out of a circumstance every person fears, the loss of a loved one in a road crash. We started our yellow ribbon initiative back in May 2012, just three months after my beautiful daughter Sarah was horrifically killed by a distracted driver in a completely avoidable crash on the Hume Freeway in NSW.

We started this because my daughter's life mattered, just as the lives of everyone you love matter. I know the pain that thousands of our fellow Australians feel every day because of the completely avoidable loss of a loved one, or for the suffering caused to a loved one who has a serious injury. My heart is broken every single day and I do not want this happening to others.

How is it acceptable that more than 10,000 Australians have been killed and over 360,000 seriously injured since my beautiful daughter Sarah was killed? Why is this tragedy still seen as a regrettable but normal situation? The trouble is that with so many fatalities and serious injuries occurring, our community often overlooks the fact that these crashes should never have happened.

Sarah's yellow ribbon has now become the symbol for road safety across our nation and so I am immensely proud when I see that yellow ribbon flying from an aerial or a 'Drive So Others Survive' sticker on the back of a vehicle. That driver is making a public statement, a commitment to protecting all our families by putting everyone's safety first. That driver is one of Sarah's Road Safety Champions!

But we can do so much more because I want you to not only show your support for the Week but to ask yourself how you can actively and publicly lead the initiative, and in doing so, become a Road Safety Warrior. Here are a couple of practical things to start:

- Make sure your yellow ribbon/sticker is on your car, caravan, truck, bike, or bicycle and display it all year round. If you don't have a vehicle, wear a yellow ribbon.
- 2. Take the Road Safety pledge at roadsafetyweek.com.au and encourage your family, friends, and colleagues to do the same.
- Explore how you can work with us in a partner or supporter capacity to spread the commitment to drive safely across your workplace, networks and community.
