Due to COVID, National Road Safety Week was moved from its usual date in May to November. We are very grateful to the NSW Government and Transport for NSW for making the NRSW 2020 launch their first and only COVID-safe event in 2020.



An initiative of the Safer Australian Roads and Highways (SARAH) Group, and brought to life by its Principal Partners (Governments, Corporates, Unions and NGOs), NRSW highlights the impact of road trauma and looks at ways we can reduce it.

In its 8th year, the Week has grown extraordinarily across the country with every State and Territory turning yellow for the week through lighting up icons, decorating their towns and cities and a significant media and social media presence.

Despite a smaller range of activites and media presence due to COVID, we manged to reach more than 120 million people through almost 2,500 media articles and social media mentions in November.

Key events included the lighting of some of our most iconic buildings and bridges in cities and regional areas across the country along with community events, the introduction of road safety policies, safety campaigns, grants and other awareness raising events. We are very grateful for the support of all our Partners and that of our Federal and State Ministers, road safety and emergency services leaders to bring NRSW to life.

However, despite all the incredible resources, time and energy devoted to reducing road trauma by so many Australians, the sad fact is that the numbers of Australians killed or seriously injured on our roads every year remains the same.

2020 challenged us to be more creative and extend our engagement virtually and in more socially distant ways. As the threat of COVID is still with us in 2021 we are excited to create another varied Week with online and offline activities.


